## **FEEDBACK ANALYSIS and ACTION TAKEN REPORT**

### **Analysis Report on Student Feedback 2022-2023**

Furthermore, the prevailing assessment methodology is deemed suitable by the majority, as it comprehensively evaluates student proficiency across the spectrum of topics anticipated in the university examinations for respective subjects.

### **Action Taken**

1. Communicate with the University's Board of Studies to identify and address specific areas within the syllabus that necessitate revisions.
2. Advocate for faculty engagement in Professional Development Programs that are aligned with their academic disciplines.
3. Expand faculty awareness regarding career prospects within their fields of expertise, thereby enabling them to impart this knowledge to students.
4. Implement systematically organized internship programs for students in advanced stages of their undergraduate programs as well as for those pursuing Master of Laws (LLM) degrees.
