III. Answer any **four** of the following. Each question carries 6 marks.

- (a) S.S Abraham Lincon left the port of Mumbai without paying the port dues. The Coast Guard followed the ship into the open sea where it was arrested. Is the arrest valid?
- (b) 'A' a British citizen working as an executive in an American company was arrested in India for the murder of an Indian. When he was released on bail, he absconded. India now received information that 'A' is running a hotel in England. What is possible course of action by India? Discuss.
- (c) The wife of a diplomat belonging to state 'S' was caught red handed in a theft case in state 'P'. The wife of the diplomat claimed diplomatic immunity. Decide.
- (d) A ship belonging to State 'X' is damaged by a mine while passing through the territorial waters of State 'Y'. State X claims compensation from state Y. Decide.
- (e) After referendum in Sudan a new state namely South Sudan comes in to existence. It fulfills all the requirements of statehood. Even then India refuses to extend recognition to the new state. South Sudan claims that she is entitled to be recognized by India and other states. India refuses. Decide
