 - (c) "P" wears a garb used by a soldier in the army with the intention of making others believe that he is a soldier in armed forces. What offence P has committed? Explain
 - (d) A, a Pakistani committed murder in Delhi. Whether he is liable for punishment under Indian Penal Code?
 - (e) A instigates B to murder C. B refuses. Whether A is liable for any offence? Explain.
