- (a) Duress as a defence
- (b) Riot
- (c) Sedition
- (d) Forgery
- (e) Homosexuality
- (f) Giving false evidence
- (g) Criminal Conspiracy

II. Answer any **four** of the following questions. Each question carries **4** marks. Answers should not exceed **120** marks.

- (a) Difference between common intention and common object
- (b) Difference between Criminal Misappropriation and Criminal Breach of Trust
- (c) Hurt and grievous hurt
- (d) Solitary confinement
- (e) Difference between kidnapping and abduction
- (f) Bigamy

III. Answer any **four** of the following questions. Each question carries **6** marks.

- (a) "A", a subordinate police personnel fired on a mob in conformity with the commands of law as per the orders of the Deputy Commissioner of police. Two persons in the mob died. Explain the criminal liability of A.
- (b) 'A' owes money to 'B' for repairing the watch. B retains the watch lawfully as a security for the debt. A takes the watch out of B's possession with the intention of depriving B of the property as a security for his debt. Whether A has committed any offence? Explain.
- (c) "P" wears a garb used by a soldier in the army with the intention of making others believe that he is a soldier in armed forces. What offence P has committed? Explain
- (d) A, a Pakistani committed murder in Delhi. Whether he is liable for punishment under Indian Penal Code?
- (e) A instigates B to murder C. B refuses. Whether A is liable for any offence? Explain.

IV. Answer any **three** of the following. Each question carries **10** marks.

- (a) Explain the ingredients of the offence of defamation highlighting the exceptions provided in Indian Penal Code.
- (b) Explain the ingredients of the offence of murder. Distinguish it from Culpable homicide.
- (c) Explain the offences relating to religion
- (d) Explain the principle "Actus non facit reum nisi mens sit rea". Explain how far *Mens rea* is recognised in statutory offences.
