1. A journalist complained to the Supreme Court that the national coastline was being sullied by unplanned development that violated a Central Government directive. Can Supreme Court register the letter as a petition?
2. Some of the residents of the municipality filed a complaint before the Sub-Divisional Magistrate alleging that the municipality to stop pollution caused by a runoff from a nearby alcohol plant resulting in form of malaria. Municipality alleged that they do not have proper financial support as well as proper funds to comply with. Advice.
3. Festival organisers of Delhi has severely damaged the flood plain of Yamuna River in Delhi due to the World Cultural Festival. Explain the liability of the organisers of World Cultural Festival.

4. Environmental clearance was granted for the construction of a hydroelectric dam on the River. The project was close to a wintering site for a bird Black-necked Crane, which is included under Schedule I species under the Wildlife Protection Act of 1972 and the 'Threatened Birds of India' literature. Advice what measures can be taken for the protection of the endangered species belongs to that area.
5. Indian Supreme Court, embracing its activist role, issued a controversial order suo moto mandating the conversion of the entire fleet of diesel powered buses in Delhi to compressed natural gas (CNG). Although the judgment seemed novel in letter and spirit, it led to exasperated tensions between the organs of the State especially the executive agencies that lacked the technology and finance to implement the impugned order. Examine the need and viability of the order in implementing the use of CNG across India.
