PART-III

Answer any four of the following problems. Each question carries six marks.

- A central statute conferred rule making power on the Central Government. The central government made certain rules and gave retrospective effect to them. Decide the validity of the Rules.
- 2. The relevant statute in sec. 92 provided that all persons drawing salary less than five thousand rupees will be appointed by the General Manager of the Undertaking. Sec. 95 further provided that no person can be dismissed by any authority subordinate to the appointing authority. The General Manager framed a Rule under the Act and delegated his power to the Assistant General Manager. A driver drawing salary less than Rs. 5,000 was dismissed by the AGM. Decide whether the dismissal order is legal.
- 3. The relevant statutory provision provided that any person storing rice within the municipal limits can do so only under a licence issued by the Municipal Corporation. This measure was adopted to avoid the spread of epidemics through rats. The 'Director of Rationing and Distribution' as representative of the Food Department of the Government, when prosecuted for violation of this provision, pleaded that the State is not bound by a law of its own creation. Decide.
- 4. The Inquiry Officer had found the charged employee guilty of the charge of making an offer of bribe to the superior officer. On the basis of the Report of the Inquiry Officer, the Disciplinary Authority punished the charged employee. This action is challenged on the ground that the Report of the Inquiry Officer was not shown to the charged employee. Decide.
- A DySP was appointed to conduct a departmental inquiry against a police constable. In order to contradict the testimony of a witness he offered himself as a witness and then decided the case. Decide whether his action can be justified. (4x6=24 Marks)
