15. The PWD enters into an oral agreement with M, a builder, to construct a school building. No formal contract is executed. After work completion, the department refuses to pay, citing no enforceable contract. Advise M.
16. A student applied for a government scholarship based on a public notification. After fulfilling all eligibility criteria and waiting six months, the scholarship scheme was abruptly scrapped without individual notice or reasons. Advise.
17. Ms. B, a social activist, learns that a government-run hospital in her city has been discharging untreated medical waste into a nearby river, endangering public health and the environment. She is not personally affected but wishes to file a legal petition to stop this practice. Can Ms. B approach the court to seek relief?
18. Three male students were dismissed from college after being found guilty of harassment. The victims' statements were recorded in their absence due to fear of intimidation. The students were given a summary of the statements and a chance to respond but were not allowed to cross-examine the complainants. They claim the dismissal is invalid due to denial of cross-examination rights. Decide.
19. The State Government enacted a law empowering the District Collector to regulate the manufacture of betel leaves during the agricultural season to ensure that laborers are engaged in agricultural activities. The Collector imposed a complete ban on the manufacture of betel leaves during the season to encourage laborers to work in agriculture. Mr. A, a betel leaf manufacturer, challenges the ban, claiming it violates his fundamental right. Decide.
