1. A Deputy Superintendent was appointed to conduct a departmental inquiry against a Police constable. In order to contradict the testimony of a witness he offered himself as a witness and then decided the case. Decide whether his action can be justified.
2. In a fake police encounter five college students were killed. The parents approached the court for compensation against the police officials who conducted the fake encounter and also against the State Government. Decide.
3. A student from a reputed university while writing his exams, puts his Register number in every page of his answer book. The University cancelled his examination results without giving her a notice. Decide.

4. The Central Government notified in the Official gazette an export promotion scheme under which an exporter will be entitled to import raw materials equal to the amount which is exported. By believing the words of Government an exporter exported 5 lakh rupees worth of good. But later he as was given import licence for an amount of 2 lakhs only. He is aggrieved by this. What remedy is available to him?
5. The Parent Act authorised the Central government to delegate the rule making power to the State government officer not below the rank of District Magistrate. The State government authorised the power to the Additional Magistrate. Examine the legal validity of the rule made and the sub-delegation.
