13. A woman is arrested and sent to civil prison in execution of a decree for payment of money. The woman objects to this claiming that she has immunity from arrest and detention in civil prison in execution of decree for payment of money. Decide.
14. A Stay of a suit is prayed for in the Civil Court by defendant under the principle of sub-judice stating that a suit with the same cause action between the same parties is pending before a foreign court. Decide whether stay of the instant suit is permissible.
15. A suit is to be filed to obtain compensation for wrong to immovable property situated within the jurisdiction of different Courts. The person approaches you for opinion. Advise him.
16. A is a tradesman in Calcutta, B carries on business in Delhi. B, by his agent in Calcutta, buys goods of A and requests A to deliver them to the East Indian Railway Company. A delivers the goods accordingly in Calcutta. But B refuses to pay the price of goods delivered. Where can A sue B?
17. During the execution proceedings, a party brings forth a question relating to the satisfaction of the decree before the executing court. The Executing court directs institution of a separate suit to determine the same. Explain the correctness of this order?
