- a. A judge of Punjab High Court on retirement decides to practice as an advocate in Bombay High Court. Is it permissible ?
- b. Parliament enacted The Essential Supplies Act for regulating the production, supply and distribution of essential commodities. Contravention of any provision was punishable with imprisonment upto 3 years, fine or both. Later a state legislature passed an Act enhancing the punishment and received the assent of the President. Thereafter Parliament amended its Act and enhanced the punishment. Which Act would be operative ?
- c. Bombay Civil Service Rules provided for the payment of subsistence allowance at the rate of Re. 1 per month to a suspended government employee while appeal was pending against his conviction and suspension. Decide the validity of the Rule.
- d. In 'X', a state of India several ordinances were repromulgated without getting the approval of the state legislature. Decide its constitutionality.
- e. State of Karnataka made a Rule under Mysore Forest Act, 1900 banning movement of forest produce between sunset and sunrise. This was challenged as isolation of freedom of trade and commerce. Decide. **(4×6=24 Marks)**
