1. Explain **any five** of the following. Each question carries **2** marks. Answer should not exceed 50 words each.

- (a) Certiorari.
- (b) Doctrine of colourable legislation.
- (c) Financial Emergency.
- (d) Federalism.
- (e) Basic structure.
- (f) Advisory jurisdiction of the Supreme Court.
- (g) Collective responsibility.

2. Answer **any four** of the following. **Each** question carries **4** marks. Answer should not exceed 120 words each.

- (a) Briefly explain the power of judiciary review?
- (b) Examine briefly the Parliament's power to regulate imposition of taxes.

- (c) What are the privileges of the President of India?
- (d) What role do legislative councils of states play?
- (e) What is the constitutional position of Governor of a state?

3. Answer **any four** of the following. **Each** question carries **6** marks.

- (a) Some MLAs of the opposition party in the state, during a no-confidence motion damage furniture, computers and files in the house. The Speaker of the house gives a written complaint to the jurisdictional police station. The police register an FIR and starts investigation. The accused legislators claim immunity from criminal proceeding. Decide.
- (b) The party which comes to power in the elections at the parliamentary party leader as its Prime Ministerial candidate and submits their consensus to the President. But the parliamentary party leader had not contested in the elections. The opposition party objects to his candidate as the Prime Minister. Decide.
- (c) The Central Government decides to divide a state into two smaller states and moves a motion in the parliament for the same. They get obtain majority in the house and proceeds with a notification in the Gazette. The opposition objects to this saying that there should be special majority for the same. Decide.
- (d) An Officer under the Central government service is dismissed from service for a negligent act not connected with his official duties. He is also not given a hearing by any Board or authority. He seeks your advice him.
- (e) A money bill is passed by the Lok Sabha and is sent to the Rajya Sabha for their assent. However the Rajya Sabha rejects the bill and send it back. What option does Lok Sabha have?

- (a) Elaborate on the write jurisdiction of the High Court under Article 226 of the Indian Constitution.
- (b) Elaborate on the various methods of amendment of Indian constitution.
- (c) When is National Emergency declared? How does it affect the individual rights?
- (d) Elaborate on the composition of Indian Parliament.
- (e) Make a detail note on the constitutional provisions relating to recruitment and service condition of civil servants.
