The government did not grant the import certificate for the full value of the goods exported. A writ was filed by AA agencies. Decide.
15. Governor of a state sent a report to the President that the law and order situation in the State was worse and that there was failure of constitutional machinery in the State. Immediately President's rule was imposed and State legislature was dissolved on the basis of the report. Decide the validity of decision taken by the President of India.
16. Parliament by Special Majority passed a constitutional amendment excluding judicial review. Decide the validity of the Amendment.
