- (d) Examine the concept of Judicial Review of the subjects in the IXth schedule of the Constitution.
- (e) A note on impeachment of the President.

III. Answer any four questions. Each question carries 6 marks.

- (a) Bill passed by both Houses of Parliament is sent to the President for his assent. The President returns the bills for reconsideration with certain amendments. The Bill is again passed with amendments. Can the President withhold his assent? Decide.
- (b) A non-practicing or academic lawyer was appointed as a judge of the Supreme Court. Is it constitutionally valid.
- (c) A law passed by the State Legislature under the State List incidentally touches upon a subject mentioned in the Union List. Discuss the validity of the law.
- (d) On the death of Central Minister of Finance, his son was appointed as the Finance Minister. Is this appointment valid?
- (e) Governor of the State suspended the death sentence imposed on a convict pending the disposal of the appeal in the Supreme Court. Decide whether the Governor's exercise of power constitutionally tenable.

- (d) Elaborate in the different methods of amendment of the constitutions of India.
- (e) Explain the advisory jurisdiction of the Supreme Court.
