 - b) A promises to B to drop a prosecution which he has instituted against B for robbery and B promises to restore the value of the things taken. Decide whether the agreement is valid.



- c) A owes B Rs. 1,000/- but the debt is barred by the limitation Act. A signs a written promise to pay B Rs. 500/- on account of the debt. Decide the validity of the contract.
- d) A promises to paint a picture for B by a certain day, at a certain price. A dies before the day. Decide the enforceability of the contract.
- e) A employ B as a contractor to construct his house at certain agreed rates. B hopes to make a profit of Rs. 500/- on the completion of the work. Before the work is half done A terminates his contract with B alleging that the work turned out by B was not good. B files a suit for a permanent injunction restraining A from getting the house built with the aid of others. Can the court grant B the reliefs prayed for?
