PART - III

Answer **any four** questions. **Each** carries **6** marks.

1. A is charged u/s 325 of the Indian Penal Code, with causing grievous hurt. He proves that he acted on grave and sudden provocation. However he was convicted under section 335, for causing grievous hurt on provocation, though it was not charged against him. Decide the legality of A's conviction.
2. In a summary trial, X the accused is convicted of two offences by the magistrate and sentenced to three month's imprisonment on each charge to run consecutively. X wishes to challenge this. Advise him.
3. A wife claims maintenance from her husband under S. 125 (1) criminal procedure code on the grounds that he has deserted her and refused to maintain her. The husband defends the claim of his wife on the ground that he has no sufficient means to maintain himself or his wife. Decide.
4. X, an accused of murder, challenges the commitment order passed against him on the ground that he was absent at the time of passing of the order of committal by the magistrate. Decide.
5. A is tried for causing grievous hurt and convicted. The person injured dies afterwards. A is tried again for culpable homicide. Decide. **(4×6=24 Marks)**

1. What is charge ? Explain the rules relating to forming of charges ? What is the effect of omission and error in framing of charges ?
2. Examine the procedure for search under the code of criminal procedure. What is the effect of illegal search on the admissibility of evidence and the validity of trial ?
3. Briefly explain the rights of an arrested person.
4. What is bail ? Discuss the conditions for granting bail and anticipatory bail ? **(3×10=30 Marks)**
