1. 'A' the petitioner, sought permission to use loudspeakers at the public meeting. The sub-inspector of police before whom the application was filed did not grant permission. Aggrieved by this 'A' moved the High Court contending that his Fundamental right to freedom of speech and expression has been violated. Decide.
2. "Rainbow Colours Ltd" , let its untreated effluents in the river Periyar. The local farmers objected to this and filed a writ of Mandamus before Kerala High Court claiming right to environment. Is it sustainable ? Decide.
3. 'X' and Co., applied to the Kerala pollution control Board to start an industry near Iddukki Reservoir for manufacturing castor oil. Kerala Pollution Control Board refused consent on the ground that the unit is a polluting industry. 'X' and Co. filed a writ petition before the Kerala High Court. Decide.
4. A night watchman of a house made loud noise at night with the intention of scaring away thieves and bad characters. Pradeep, resident of the same colony filed a case under Section 133 of the Criminal Procedure Code, 1973 to abate nuisance. Will he succeed ?
5. In the city called 'Hila' open drains have polluted the area adversely affecting the purity of water in the wells. Hence the residents of the city Hila filed a case against the Municipal Council of the city. Decide. **(4×6=24 Marks)**
