1. 'X', a Sunni Muslim died leaving his wife, mother, son and two daughters. Distribute the estate. Give reasons for each distribution.
2. 'X', a Christian died leaving his wife, two sons, Father, Mother and two sons of a predeceased son. Who are entitled to succeed the property and to what extent.
3. 'A' a Muslim executed a will in favour of 1/3 of his property in favour of one of his son and 2/3 of the remaining property in favour of his daughter's son. Examine the validity of the Will.
4. A male Hindu left his Father, son, daughter and two sons of a 'predeceased daughter'. Distribute his estate according to Hindu Succession Act, 1956.
5. A partition was effected in a Joint Family. Two years after, 'X' a coparcener claims the re-opening of partition on the ground that some portion of the property already partitioned were not belonged to Joint Family property.
