- 1. A father of a Hindu joint family consisting of himself and his sons executed a mortgage of family property which was neither for necessity nor for payment of antecedent debt. The mortgage obtained a decree on the mortgage and was bringing the property to sale in execution. At that stage the sons intervened and wanted to prevent the execution of the decree against their interests in the property. Whether the sons are liable to pay the debts of their father and the decree obtained against the father for payment of debt can be enforced against the son.
 - 2. In a joint family, there is father and four sons. A one of the sons migrates to Delhi and works and earn property in Delhi. Whether other coparceners can claim the share from the properties of A?
 - 3. A has two children, and no more; John and Mary. John dies before his father leaving his wife pregnant. Then A dies leaving Mary surviving him, and in due time a child of John is born. Distribute A's property.
 - 4. A died leaving father, mother, daughter and brother, distribute the inheritance according to Shia law.
