3. A song was composed for a feature film. Later its lyricist, composer, singer, director and producer of the film claimed right over the song. Decide.
4. All India Reporter reported a judgement of Supreme Court in its volume I of 2015. A local legal magazine named "Legal Scholar" copied verbatim from AIR and published. AIR filed a case against "Legal Scholar" for copyright infringement. Decide.
5. Lakme Ltd. was carrying on the business of selling cosmetics products in the trade name 'Lakme'. Another company started selling cosmetic creams in the name 'Like-me'. Lakme Ltd. filed a case against the new company. Decide.
