Examine the constitutional safeguards implemented through judicial precedents related to rights of the arrested persons.

Explain the procedure under the Probation of Offenders Act, 1958 in case of offender failing to observe conditions of bond.

Discuss the role of child welfare committee under the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015.

Answer **any four** questions. **Each** question carries **6** marks.

Identify whether a police officer below the rank of an Inspector can be appointed as a Assistant Public Prosecutor in charge of a particular case.

A, with intent to cause injury to B, falsely accuses him of having committed an offence, knowing that there is no just or lawful ground for such charge. On the trial, A gives false evidence against B, intending thereby to cause B to be convicted of a capital offence. Identify the offences against which A can be charged.

A is charged by a Magistrate of the second class with, and convicted by him of, theft of property from the person of B. Can A subsequently be charged with, and tried for, robbery on the same facts?

4. A police officer seeks your legal opinion in order to effect an arrest of a woman. Advise the police officer.
5. A complaint was made to the Chief Minister who in turn sent it to the Additional IGP, a superior in rank to an officer in charge of a police station. Is this a valid and legal complaint given the fact that as per section 154 of the CrPC, information relating to the commission of a cognizable offence is to be given to an officer in charge of a police station?
