English education and English language became popular in India in the centuries India was ruled by English colonial forces and both have worked positively and negatively in those times. It has helped Indians and it has also worked against some of the interests of the nation. The waves of enlightenment embodying values of democracy and science spread across the sub-continent as a result of the coming of the British and the consequent rule. British rule and use of force created the need for unity and freedom among people in the warring regions and small kingdoms. The need for imagining a nation and the demand for selfgovernment emerged. English education contributed to all this significantly. Those who led freedom movement were shaped by the writings of the English and the modern culture. Our struggle for freedom has been inspired by the struggles for freedom in America and the ideals of French revolution. The proficiency in the ruler's language, English, and the use of it as a link-language, were crucial in bringing the whole Indian middle class together into the freedom struggle. This would have been difficult without English and other modern values. In this historical, long-drawn, centuries-spanning and unequal conflict of cultures, India did suffer too in visible and painful ways. The distortion of cultures of India

along with the loss of the mother tongue is painful instances of the damages suffered. It is worthy to note that the coming of English language and literature helped us to enjoy the remarkable writings of Shakespeare, Milton, Keats and Shaw. But these writings propagated colonial values and readers have to be aware of that too. The priority given to English resulted in the sad condition of Malayalam language and literature being neglected too in Kerala. The same was the situation of other Indian languages. To conclude it must be said that conscious effort must be made to keep a balance among languages. English in the context of Kerala has to be used as a language that should work smoothly with Malayalam.
