14. State Y was the colony of State X for over Two hundred Fifty years. State Y became independent in 1947. During the colonial period, State X had signed treaties on behalf of State Y confirming its boundaries with the neighbouring States A, B and C. After independence State Y claims that the boundary treaties are not binding on it and wants to renegotiate and redraw the boundaries. Decide.
15. The King of state A during his stay in state B promised to marry Miss Helen. Subsequently, the king refused to marry her. Miss Helen wants to file a suit against the King in state B. Decide
16. State X, claims right to passage through the territory of State Y for ingress and egress to its territorial enclaves situated within the territory of State Y. State X points out the existence of a bilateral local custom to substantiate its claim. Decide.
