- III. Answer any four of the following. Each question carries 6 marks.
 - (a) As part of execution of a decree against Kumar by Arun, half of Kumar's gratuity paid to him by his employer while he retired from service was attached. Kumar challenges this attachment. Decide.
 - (b) An ex parte decree is passed in a suit against Vimal. He cries foul and claims in the court that his counsel had not informed him of the dates of appearance in the court. He claims that it was his counsel's mistake and that this delay should be condoned. Decide.
 - (c) A civil court rejects the plaint filed by Mr.Anvar for failure to disclose cause of action. Mr. Anvar files an appeal against it in the superior court. The defendant challenges the maintainability of the appeal. Decide
 - (d) 'A' files a suit against 'B' for recovery of possession of a house situated at Kochi on the basis of a sale deed executed by 'B'. The suit is heard and dismissed by a court of competent jurisdiction. 'A' after two years again files a suit against 'B' for the same house, on the same ground, which he had asserted in the previous suit in the same Court. Can the Court try the subsequent suit filed by 'A' against 'B'?
 - (e) Anand filed a suit against Binu, the priest of a temple for declaration that the religious rites performed by Binu during the puja of the deity were not proper. Binu contends that he has been performing the puja as per the Hindu religious rites. He also claims that the suit is not maintainable. Decide.
